#### INTERNATIONAL CARNIVOROUS PLANT SOCIETY NEWS

An article of special interest in the September issue is the species description of *Nepenthes limiana*. As you read the botanical history of *Nepenthes limiana*, notice how at first various (famous) taxonomists shoehorned the dried, squashed plants mounted as herbarium specimens with existing species or called them a hybrid. This is science in action. Really. When you have too little data to

understand something, you just park it somewhere convenient and move on until you or someone else can get additional data later, in this case much later. It took quite a few expeditions to fully understand about *Nepenthes limiana* and the other known *Nepenthes* species in peninsular Malaysia. Chances are additional expeditions in the area could accumulate enough additional data to help delimit other *Nepenthes* that are not now recognised as separate species. Also, notice in the article at the end there are several new questions related to *Nepenthes limiana*. That is also science in action. The more you know the more you know you don't know. We hope to publish more of this story in the future.

## **MEETINGS**



We hope you can attend one of our meetings and enjoy the fellowship of other enthusiasts for these wonderful plants.


## **SYDNEY**



## **BUSINESS ARISING/GENERAL BUSINESS**

- 1. Our stall at Kariong Rare Plant Fair has been paid for. We have a double stall. We also have four additional passes for volunteers, for a total of six to attend our stall at any given time. Volunteers have free entry and get time to shop several minutes before the masses enter the gates. It's on the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> of September. Dave is available on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup>.
- 2. We have paid for the annual summary of financial affairs submitted Services NSW so that we can be an incorporated society.
- 3. Wollondilly Shire Council is putting on a plant fair and garden expo on the 30<sup>th</sup> October 2023, at the Picton Botanic Gardens, Regreme Road, Picton. The fees for a stall are quite reasonable. The details of the event are in the society's g-mail account, under the 'Events' folder. Dave will follow up for our society to attend. The organisers are not taking registrations as yet.
- 4. The society has been invited by Daniel Webb (0424 924 992, dan@107.org.au) of 107 at Green Square to their 'Plant Party' for the 9th September, 2023. The event is, in essence, a plant collector's fair, but with a bit of a difference. In addition to a variety of plant vendors who will be in attendance, the event will host guest speakers, artistic workshops with a botanic focus and a curated floral display competition, open to gardening clubs and societies of Sydney and their members. Entry is free. Cash prizes for societies for the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place displays. Individuals who enter may utilise our insurance form from the Gardens Club to cover themselves if they come under the banner of our society. No members were available to display and inability to attend to be communicated.

One of the sellers who regularly attends Clarendon has organised a plant fair in late October at Hartley Vale and has invited our society to it. Our two members who sell plants in the Lithgow area could not attend, so we have declined this year. The event will be on again in 2024. The stall will be free.

- 5. We have moved the Annual Show this year from the Friday afternoon to the following Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> of December from 9am to 3pm. Normal monthly meeting is still on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> December. The venue will be in another room, not in the meeting room we currently use.
- 6. We have field guides for Sydney, Canberra and Melbourne area, Melbourne is now out with copies available. Copies available \$20.00 for non-members and \$15.00 for members. Work continues on the almost complete Cairns field guide, but printing will be on hold till 2024, and Brisbane field guide is 70% done.
- 7. A 4/5-day trip to Darwin is being organised in May 2024 with Dave and Steve from the Victorian society and people are welcome to join if interested.
- 8. Dave has mentioned organising a field trip with society members looking for CPs in the Blue Mountains area possibly 24<sup>th</sup> September. Dave is still organising the trip.
- 9. Robert Gibson asked for articles for our biannual journal to members. He has enough for September's journal, yet more articles for future publications are always welcome. He is currently organising the current journal for release. Robert has finished the September 2023 journal and it's currently being reviewed. Exciting new articles await!

## **IN THE GREENHOUSE**

## **ALDROVANDA**

Plants will end their dormancy. Turions will commence growth and start to appear on the surface of the water.

## **BROCCHINIA / CATOPSIS**

Maintain high light levels and humidity. Protect from frost. Feed with 1/4 strength urea free liquid fertiliser.

#### **BYBLIS**

Byblis gigantea and lamellata will be in full growth. Flowering begins. Cross-pollinate flowers using the "Buzz" technique. Keep the soil moist.

The northern annual species of *Byblis* may be sown now. Germination commences when temperatures regularly reach 30°C. Artificial heat and/or smoke/GA3 treatment will induce germination.

## **CEPHALOTUS**

Keep the soil moist but well drained. Avoid fungal problems by keeping good air movement around the plants. Flowering occurs in mid to late Spring.

#### **DARLINGTONIA**

*Darlingtonia* will end dormancy and commence growth. Keep moist and expose to cold temperatures for as long as possible. Stratified seed will begin to germinate.

## **DIONAEA**

All VFTs will end dormancy and commence growth with fresh leaves and flowers. Consider removing the flower spike and use for vegetative propagation.

#### **DROSERA**

Tuberous *Drosera* are near the end of the growth cycle, with the tall growing species in flower. Pollinate the flowers. Keep the pots moist.

Pygmy *Drosera* are in leaf production phase with some species flowering. Keep plants moist to wet.

Other Winter growing species such as *D. ramentacea, cistiflora* and *pauciflora* will be in active growth and flower. Keep the pots moist.

Tropical and sub-tropical species will be in growth. Keep protected from frost. Temperate Drosera such as *D. filiformis*, *D. intermedia* and *D. rotundifolia* will emerge from dormancy.

## **DROSOPHYLLUM**

*Drosophyllum* will be in active growth. *Drosophyllum* tolerates higher soil moisture levels during the cooler months and may be watered using the tray method. Flowering commences in Spring. Flowers are self-fertile.

#### **GENLISEA**

Genlisea should be in flower and active growth. Keep the water levels high with these species. Keep protected from frost.

## **HELIAMPHORA**

Keep plants in a bright and humid location. Light levels may be increased with the cooler nights. Feed with 1/4 strength urea free liquid fertiliser.

## **NEPENTHES**

Spring is a great time for *Nepenthes*. Aim to keep the lowland plants above 15°C. Spotting of the leaves is a sign of temperatures being too low.

Highland species enjoy the cooler nights and will continue to grow. Keep plants above 5°C.

## **PINGUICULA**

Mexican species/hybrids are dormant. Look out for the Summer carnivorous leaves in the coming months. Keep the soil drier. Some of the non-carnivorous leaves may be removed for leaf cuttings.

Warm-temperate species such as *P. primuliflora* and P. *lusitanica* will continue growth. Flowering occurs in the Spring. Keep the water up to *P. primuliflora* and take leaf cuttings.

## **RORIDULA**

Roridula is in active growth. Flowering occurs in winter and spring. Sow seed now onto moist peat/sand. Germination may take 3-8 weeks. Keep the soil moist and place in very bright situations. Ensure good air circulation to avoid fungal attack of the seedlings.

#### SARRACENIA

All *Sarracenia* species/hybrids will resume growth with fresh leaf shoots and flowers. *Sarracenia flava* and *oreophila* species look their best in spring. Increase the water level / frequency and keep in full sun.

## **UTRICULARIA**

Most terrestrial *Utricularia* will be in active growth and flower. Keep moist to wet.

Flowering will resume. Aquatic *Utricularia* will resume growth.

Winter growing species, such as *U. multifida* and *U. menziesii* will be in active growth and in flower.

Tropical *Utricularia* - Maintain higher temperatures, humidity, and air movement. Keep soils moist.

## POTTING MIXES






#### THE SAVAGE GARDEN
